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

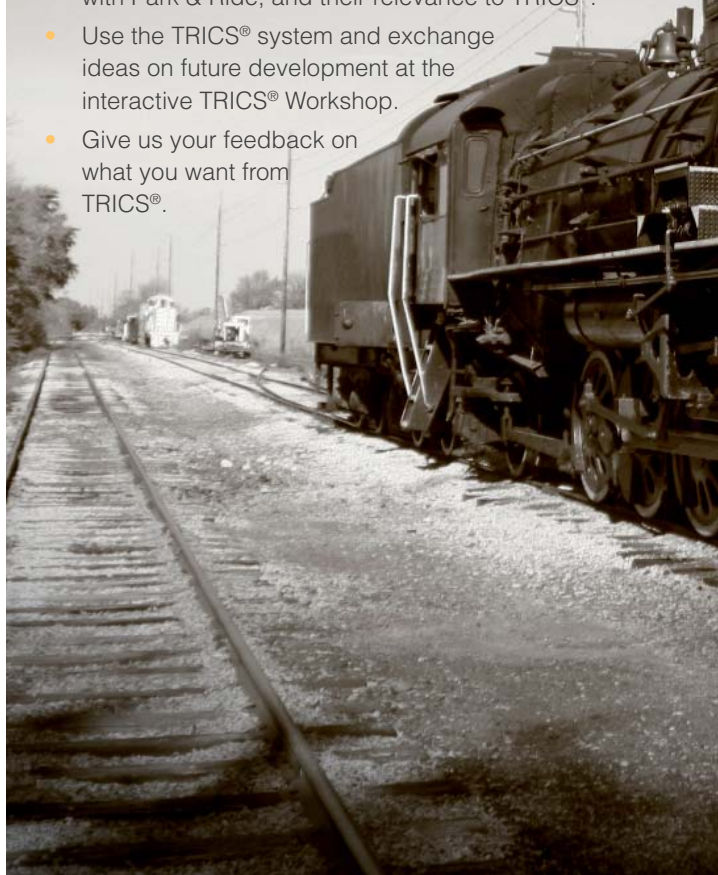

TRICS is the national trip rate generation system for the UK and Ireland, used to inform, challenge and validate assumptions made in transport assessments for development proposals.

The annual TRICS® User Meetings are increasingly popular forums for all members of the TRICS® Community from across the UK and Ireland. Since the first meeting in 1996, the events have grown to become the most important dates in the calendar for users of the only national standard system of trip generation analysis. Every year since they began, the User Meetings have played a very important role in shaping the continuous development of TRICS®, with everyone present getting the opportunity to have their say on the system's future.

The format of the day is aimed at both new and experienced users of TRICS®, covering a wide range of important and informative topics. This year, we look back at 20 years of TRICS® development, and forward to a busy period as we introduce many new system features. The venues

The Imperial War Museum is regarded as one of the essential sights of London. It is a multi-branch national museum founded in 1917 to record the story of the Great War and the contributions made to it by the peoples of the Empire. In addition to its conventional museum role, it is also a major national art gallery, a national archive of written and audio-visual records, and a research centre. This is an ideal venue with excellent facilities, and is accessibly located. The nearest Underground station is Lambeth North, with the nearest main line station being Waterloo.

The National Railway Museum in York boasts a collection of over 100 locomotives and nearly 200 other items of rolling stock, telling the railway story from the early 19th century to the present day. Permanent displays include the jewel in the crown, "Palaces on Wheels", with Royal saloons dating back to the pre-Victorian era. The museum is very easy to reach by public transport, being only a few minutes walk from York railway station (there is a direct pedestrian route to the museum via the station footbridge).

Free attendance
