About

TRICS is the UK and Ireland's standard system for trip generation analysis, and 2015 sees the 20th annual TRICS User Meeting taking place, this year at the Skinner's Hall venue in London. These annual events have proven to be popular with both new and experienced TRICS users, and this year's gathering of the TRICS Community is sure to be well attended as we return to the capital.

Now in its 27th year of development, TRICS now contains over 7,000 transport surveys across 110 types of development, covering all regions of the UK and Ireland. Our system is used at around 500 locations, including consultancies, local authorities and educational establishments. It remains a vital and integral part of the Transport Assessment process.

Our annual User Meeting is the ideal opportunity to meet with and discuss TRICS and its role in Transport Assessments with other members of the TRICS Community. The event is held in a productive yet informal manner (including a buffet lunch) over the course of a day, and can be considered a forum for the exchange of ideas for the future development of TRICS. Our system has evolved through years of interaction with our member organisations, and this event is the ideal opportunity for this. The day consists of a number of presentations

relating to TRICS and its associated projects, covering topics such as system development and good practice, our survey methodology, the results of our annual User Survey, and guest speakers covering other subjects of interest. It is a technical event designed for our system's users, and feedback we have received over the years has been very positive.

In addition to the presentations, the afternoon session is split into two options, a TRICS system demonstration (ideal for new users) and an open forum where you can share your ideas for the future of the system. TRICS is proud of its unique interactive approach to system development, allowing all users to have their say in its future. Feedback we have received during these events has often directly led to system changes over time, and we value everyone's input enormously.

SKINNERS' HALL

The Venue

Skinner's Hall is the country house venue in the heart of the city. It is a Grade 1 listed building nestled in the heart of London, and, steeped in history and tradition, dates back to 1670. It is beautifully furnished and elegantly styled.

Enter through the ceremonial gates and courtyard to the warmth and atmosphere of a fine country house complete with outstanding paintings, coats of arms and period furniture. There are several different rooms with many wonderful features which include the stunning round gallery and open fire in the Outer Hall, the magnificent polished East India Table in the Old Court Room, and the beautiful Italianate roof garden featuring a central fountain. The event is being held within the venue's Great Hall, adorned with paintings, tapestries and Coat of Arms.

Skinner's Hall is a truly unique venue perfect for special events and hospitality. It is the home of the Worshipful Company of Skinner's, one of the City of London's Great Livery Companies whose principle activities are education and charitable Trusts. The venue was rebuilt after the Great Fire of London, and is a premises of great history and special interest.

Location

By Tube

The nearest tube stations are Cannon Street or Mansion House on the Circle & District Lines, and Bank on the Central Line.

On Foot

From Cannon Street station, if you exit onto Cannon Street itself, turn left and then left again into Dowgate Hill. Cannon Street Station also has an exit on Dowgate Hill itself.

From Mansion House Station take exit 1; Queen Victoria Street/Garlick Hill. At the exit then take the Cannon Street option and turn right onto Cannon Street. Dowgate Hill is on the right hand side before the main train station.

From Bank Station take exit 8. This leads onto Warbrook, carry on until this road reaches Cannon Street. Dowgate Hill is the road opposite.

Car Parking

There is metered parking on Dowgate Hill and surrounding roads.
