TRICS® User Meeting

Now in its 25th year of development, TRICS® remains the national standard system of trip generation analysis, with well over 6,000 transport surveys across the UK and Ireland, covering over 100 development types. With some 500 user locations across the regions, it remains a vital and integral part of the Transport Assessment process, and every year new users are introduced to the system through our popular annual TRICS® User Meeting.

Although we remain in a time of economic challenges, use of TRICS® has remained steady across the TRICS® Community, and it remains as popular as it has been throughout its 25-year history. This is partly down to the unique interactive approach to system development, allowing all members of the TRICS® Community to have their say in the future of the system. These meetings are extremely important to us, and feedback given during these days in particular has always made a significant contribution to system development and data collection. The User Meeting should be an important date in the calendars of all of our user organisations.

This year is one of significant development and enhancement, as the redesign of the TRICS® user interface completes its period of consultation and the period of system programming gets underway. We have received a great deal of feedback from consultees, and we are pleased to announce the scheduled full launch of TRICS® 7 in December 2013. At the time of the User Meeting we will be well on our way to having an Alpha version ready for testing, and we would like to take the opportunity of the User Meeting to bring you all up to date on progress and our schedule. After a number of successful years maintaining and improving TRICS® 6, we very much look forward to bringing you an enhanced new series of quarterly system updates that maximises user-friendliness and efficiency, whilst at the same time remaining committed to an expanding programme of annual nationwide transport surveys.

We shall also be giving presentations on recent enhancements to TRICS® 6, including the introduction of a new Travel Plan Monitoring Report generator designed to track and report progress of Travel Plans at sites surveyed as part of our Standardised Assessment Methodology (SAM). We shall look at a recent audit of research into possible correlations between trip generation data in the UK and New Zealand, we shall discuss the possible introduction of a Knowledge Base in the TRICS® Library module, and we'll be investigating the potential for a policy-level module of trip generation analysis, designed to present a higher-level analysis for larger mixed

use developments. The morning session ends with a look at TRICS® from a developer's perspective, and after lunch there will be presentations on the 2013 TRICS® Good Practice Guide and our expanding annual nationwide data collection programme. In the final afternoon session, users will have the choice of attending an Open Forum on the development of TRICS®, or a detailed system demonstration (ideal for those new to TRICS®).

The Venue

Performances, gigs, theatre, dance, events; TOM – The Old Market, recently renovated, is a dynamic cultural venue just outside Brighton's city centre. TOM's main space is a 300-500 capacity room with the flexibility to showcase everything from rock bands to exciting new theatre or cabaret.
